


About Vasco:


Vasco has been designing, manufacturing and selling mobile translation devices that will break language barriers for you, wherever you are.

The company was founded in 2008 by Maciej Góralski. What inspired him to create translator devices were his personal experiences during the studies and travels abroad. Maciej noticed there is a demand on the market for advanced devices that can facilitate communication between people who use different languages.





Vasco Translators are used by tourists, people working abroad as well as by companies and organizations serving clients of different nationalities (such organizations include tourist facilities, offices as well as medical and uniformed services). Thanks to Vasco Translator devices, people can forget about language challenges and focus on relaxing, discovering the world and developing their businesses.



Today, Vasco is one of the leaders on the electronic translators market. **The company operates in almost 20 countries on 4 continents, and has nearly 200 employees**. The head office is located in Kraków, but the company has local representatives in various countries around the world.



PMM Vasco Emergency Team

Vasco, together with the Polish Medical Mission, founded a rapid response rescue team which consists of doctors, nurses, and paramedics. Its goal is to provide rapid aid in regions around the world, affected by natural disasters or humanitarian crises. PMM Vasco Emergency Team will be the second in Poland and the one of 30 teams in the world accredited by the World Health Organization.

The originator and one of the members of the PMM Vasco Emergency Team is Maciej Góralski, the CEO of Vasco. Maciej also participates actively in various trainings as well as oversees the team development.

Vasco's social engagement

With its resources, Vasco wants to bring help to those in need. **The company provides translators to support the activities of various aid organizations**, such as Minority Rights Group, Fundacja Ocalenie (the Salvage Foundation), Medycy na Granicy (Medics on the Border) and the Ronald McDonald Foundation.

After the war in Ukraine had started, Vasco provided 500 translators to 120 institutions involved in helping war victims.

These were, for example, hospitals, care centers and NGOs supporting refugees in Poland, Romania, Spain, Slovakia, and Portugal.
